While on routine patrol in the area of HY 21/HY 41 in the Winnebago Co. City of Oshkosh, I observed a vehicle traveling eastbound through the roundabouts on HY 21. Dep. Kohl W51 was riding in my passenger seat along with my K-9 partner, Franz W296.

The vehicle that we observed traveling eastbound through the roundabouts on HY 21/HY 41 did not have a registration plate affixed to the rear bumper. The vehicle in question was a 4-door sedan, red in color. I followed the vehicle as it traveled eastbound on HY 21 and as I began to turn on my emergency lights to conduct a traffic stop for Failure to Display Plates, the vehicle began to merge onto the HY 41 northbound on ramp from HY 21. The vehicle then slowly began to drift to the right hand shoulder and then veered back to the left hand shoulder and came to a complete stop. Again, the vehicle did not have a registration plate on it and was a 4-door red in color Oldsmobile.

Dep. Kohl was the primary officer on the traffic stop and did make a driver's side approach on the vehicle. Dep. Kohl identified the male subject and lone occupant of the vehicle as Logan D. Hill, [REDACTED]

I established a cover position on the passenger side and observed Dep. Kohl to speak Logan in regard to why he was pulled over. Since the vehicle did not have a registration plate on it, Dep. Kohl did move to the front of the vehicle and obtained the VIN from the bottom of the front windshield. While Dep. Kohl was doing this I did have a chance to observe Logan in the driver's seat. It should be known that the entire time that Dep. Kohl talked to Logan, his hands were fixed on the steering wheel at the 10 and 2 position. It seemed rather odd because his hands were extremely tense and did not come off the steering wheel at any point in his conversation with Dep. Kohl. This is an unusual behavior and I took note of it.

After Dep. Kohl gathered all of his information, he began to walk back to the squad car and I informed him that I would be conducting a K-9 sniff of the vehicle. Dep. Kohl then continued back toward the squad car to issue the warning for Failure to Display License Plate.

While Dep. Kohl was inside the squad car issuing the warning, I made contact with the driver and asked him to step out of the vehicle. The driver again identified as Logan Hill, initially asked me why. I told him that I just wanted to talk to him and Logan then complied and walked to the rear of the vehicle. I informed Logan that we were conducting a drug interdiction detail and that I was going to conduct a K-9 sniff of the vehicle while Dep. Kohl issued his warning.

contraband and none was located. Logan was then escorted to the rear passenger seat of my squad car where he was placed inside with the seat belt securely fastened.

It was from this point on that Logan was extremely argumentative with us and began to speak about topics ranging from religion to Jesus Christ to Maritime and Common Law. Logan questioned our actions throughout our contact with him and was very argumentative through the entire incident.

While placing Logan under arrest, we did ask him who he wanted to have tow his vehicle since it was a traffic hazard and needed to be moved, since Logan was going to be transported to the Winnebago Co. Jail for a Book and Release on his charges. Logan said he was not from the area and did not know any wrecker service. The next rotational wrecker which was Jim's Towing was then called to the scene to remove the vehicle.

After Logan was placed into the rear of the squad, I retrieved my K-9 partner, Franz, and placed him inside the vehicle to do a more thorough search, since we had not found any sort of drugs, just the paraphernalia. K-9 Franz showed heavy interest in the passenger side seat area and there were numerous pieces of property on the passenger side seat area, but no contraband was located.

I then removed K-9 Franz from the interior of the vehicle and placed him back inside my squad car. A CIBR check was done on Logan and he did not have any past drug or criminal convictions.

We remained on scene until Jim's Towing arrived and when they arrived, they removed the vehicle from the area and we transported Logan to the Winnebago Co. Jail.

Upon arrival at the jail, Dep. Kohl removed Logan to a secure area in the sallyport and he was again searched for any further weapons or contraband. None were located and he was escorted into the Pre-Booking area.

While inside the Pre-Booking area, the County Wide Booking Information Sheet was completed, charging Logan with 961.573(1), Possession of Drug Paraphernalia which was a Book & Release charge. It should also be noted that throughout our contact with Logan, he requested to speak with our supervisor. Logan wanted a supervisor to come to the scene but I informed him that since we were taking him to jail that the supervisor would meet with him at the Winnebago Co. Jail.

When we arrived at the jail, Lt. Meyer W17 met with Logan in the Pre-Booking area and had a conversation with him.

After all booking information was complete, custody of Logan was turned over to the Winnebago Co. Jail staff.

I then traveled to the Winnebago Co. Sheriff's Ofc. Evidence Room. Once at the evidence room, I tested the glass pipe using a Narco Pouch and received a positive test result for THC and the pipe was properly secured in an evidence envelope which was properly sealed and labeled and placed into evidence locker #11. The locker was then secured.

had a very tight grip on his steering wheel where his hands remained during my contact with Logan at his vehicle.

I ran the VIN [REDACTED] which returned on a 1991 Oldsmobile Cutlass, 4-door sedan, red in color. The vehicle had no license plates associated with it.

The address on Logan's DL was listed as [REDACTED], however, Logan stated that he is currently going back and forth between two places as he is currently building a house and that he is living between his [REDACTED] address and the [REDACTED] address.

I asked Logan who he purchased the vehicle from and he stated that he purchased it from Don [REDACTED] however, the vehicle returned to Justine R. [REDACTED] I questioned Logan on this and he stated that Justine is Don's daughter.

I returned to the squad and completed written warning 2P90PPTJR7 for Failure to Display Plate, 341.15(1). While I was completing the warning, Dep. Zill began conducting a K-9 sniff of the vehicle.

Dep. Zill asked me to stand with Logan as K-9 Franz did indicate on the vehicle. We then performed a search of Logan's person and in doing so, a glass pipe in Logan's front left pants pocket was found. Logan stated this was used for tobacco products.

I placed handcuffs onto Logan behind his back, checked the handcuffs for tightness and safety locked them. We continued to search Logan's person finding nothing of interest and escorted him to the rear passenger seat of squad #12.

I then assisted in completing a hand search of Logan's vehicle, finding nothing of interest. We then requested the next rotational wrecker to remove the vehicle from the roadway. Jim's Towing Service arrived to remove the vehicle.

We then transported Logan to the Winnebago Co. Jail.

Upon arrival at the Winnebago Co. Jail, I performed a secondary search of Logan's person finding no further contraband on Logan's person. Logan was then escorted into the Winnebago Co. Jail Pre-Booking area where I completed the County Wide Booking Information Sheet, listing a single charge of Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, 961.573(1) as a Book and Release charge.

Logan was then turned over to Winnebago Co. Jail staff without incident.
